Welcome to a new academic year at CSUF!

Last year was an exciting year—our campus and department have been undergoing much change. We are happy to welcome **President Ronald Rochon** to our campus and **Dean Celestina Barbosa-Leiker** to the College of Health and Human Development. We also welcome new faculty member, **Jason Smith**, who brings expertise in Public Health and Climate Law to our department. In our shared department offices, we welcome a new Kinesiology Department Coordinator, **Alan Garduno**, along with a new cohort of student assistants. In addition, we hired two full-time staff who are supporting faculty grants, **Theresa Do**, Program Coordinator for the NAARE Program and **Kristal Ly**, Program Manager for the PATH Academy.

This singular curriculum includes coursework in evidence-based approaches to public health, public health and health care systems, planning and management to promote health, policy in public health, communications and systems thinking. During their second-year, students will receive in-depth training in one of 3 concentrations: community health promotion, epidemiology, and environmental and occupational health and safety. I am so proud of our faculty who have worked so diligently over the past two years to design a program that transforms the way we teach and learn public health. It is exciting and energizing to think in new ways, and we cannot wait to implement the changes. The priority application deadline for our next cohort of MPH students is **December 15th**. Finally, three of our public health students, Eriq Lopez, Danielle Mecano, and Jared Luis-Ortiz, were selected to participate in the NIH-funded Minority Health and Health Disparities Research Training Program (MHRT; PI Dr. Marcelo Tolmasky). Our MHRT Scholars spent 10 weeks in a summer research training program in Chiang Mai Thailand with our colleagues at the Department of Community Medicine at Chiang Mai University, where they designed and implemented research on particulate matter (PM) 2.5 and public health. We are proud of our students!

Our faculty continue to be research active. In the last academic year, Public Health faculty brought in \$4,962,458 across 12 new and continuing awards. Current training grants that support our students include:

MSTEM STAR prepares students to pursue advanced degrees in MSTEM aging fields through a multidimensional aging science program, including structured research experiences, aging-science curriculum, and support and engagement activities. NAARE accelerates student success through cultivating deep interest in biomedical fields and fostering an engaged, supportive community. PATH Academy trains and supports students, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds, in their pursuit of health-related careers, entailing multiple student programs, many of which include mentorship and partnerships with community organizations. Each of these programs provides opportunities and value to our students.

Our college has a long history of valuing service to our local community. This past year, our Public Health students provided a total of 51,120 hours of internship service to our local communities, providing a value of **\$817,920** (a low estimate calculated at minimum wage).

It was truly an honor to serve as Distinguished Faculty Marshal at our Commencement in May. What an absolute joy to return from sabbatical and share "the best day of the year" with our students, faculty, and staff! I remain more grateful that I can express to work with the colleagues and students here at CSUF.
