




Dr. Jeff Fortuna




Dr. Jeff Fortuna possessed a passion for educating and helping others. He had an insatiable intellectual curiosity. He was deeply dedicated to his work and to his family. He loved being a part of Cal State Fullerton and specifically being a member of the teaching faculty in the Department of Health Science.



Jeff was raised in San Bernardino and graduated from Pacific High School in 1966. After high school, Jeff attended the University of Arizona, where he graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Education in 1972.

He continued his studies and graduated from California State University, Long Beach with a Master's Degree in Public Health and Loma Linda University with a Doctorate in Public Health.



After completing his doctorate Jeff embarked on a long, successful career as a professor, teacher, writer, lecturer, researcher, and interventionist in the fields of public health, nutrition, pharmacology, and related health sciences.




Jeff was a lecturer in the Department of Health Science (now Public Health) at Cal State Fullerton from 1987 to 2014.

During that same time he also taught courses at Chapman University and at Cal State Long Beach.



Jeff's passion was always with his students. He was a highly respected faculty member of the Department of Health Science at Cal State Fullerton. He taught multiple sections of HESC 321 Drugs and Society; HESC 350 Nutrition: Link to Better Health; and other Health Science courses for over 27 years.



Jeff's expertise in brain chemistry and behavior research led him to publish Food, Brain Chemistry, and Behavior — a book on mental performance and mood, cravings, depression and recovery from addiction.






In addition to teaching, Jeff was a consultant to GlaxoSmithKline Beecham amongst his numerous professional accomplishments.

Throughout his career Jeff also provided extensive Continuing Medical Education (CME) for physicians on treatment advances, nutrition and pharmaceuticals.




As it turned out, Jeff's brother Jim was a match and went through with the bone marrow donation. Jeff improved briefly, but sadly passed away on February 22, 2014.
